Avenues for Revenue in Goan Heritage Houses

Goan home owners struggle to maintain their ancestral houses due to forbidden costs of materials and non-availability of skilled labor. There are various ways of converting the Goan heritage house for adaptive reuse. One such adaptive reuse of a Goan heritage house is to convert it into a wedding/events venue. We already have a couple of houses that are doing that. One of the first families to do this, was the Cotta family from Agacaim. Mr Einstein Cotta initiated this concept a couple of decades ago.

We also have the Figueiredo mansion in Loutolim and the Silva heritage house in Benaulim. This was also possible, since these houses had a lot of vacant land around their house.

The Late Mrs. Sarah Fernandes opened the doors of her house to the public for a nominal fee, around 25 years ago. Other Goan heritage house owners have also opened their doors so that people from all over the world can visit and view these houses.

They charge a very nominal fee, and conduct a guided tour of the house. One surely is in awe of the furniture, the flooring patterns, false ceilings, crockery, etc. The furniture seen in these Goan houses is indeed unique and is not found in any residential house across the globe, not even in Portugal. The fees collected contribute in some way towards the maintenance of these houses. To name a few; Braganza Pereira House and the Menezes Braganza House in Chandor, the Figueiredo Mansion, and Casa Alvares in Loutolim.

Many other houses intend to move in this direction, as it is welcomes income toward the maintenance of these houses.

Art galleries are also a viable option to have in the Goan heritage house. Daegal Godinho has converted a part of the Godinho heritage house into an amazing interactive art gallery known as Carpe Diem at Majorda. Besides displaying artworks, which are also sometimes sold, Carpe Diem also conducts workshops and activities throughout the year with various artists demonstrating how to make some of Goa's traditional crafts, such as terracotta pottery, etc. Carpe Diem also has a café which helps in generating revenue for this Goan house. It also has a small amphitheater where they have interesting presentations and group discussions. To sum up, Carpe Diem is an art and learning center equipped with an art gallery along with creative workshops and performance spaces. These activities help in revenue generation which is used for the maintenance of this Goan house. The Goan heritage house provides a unique ambiance for an enriching experience of art and craft at Carpe Diem, located in the village of Majorda, Salcete Goa.

Goan heritage houses are unique to Goa as they exist only in Goa and are not found anywhere else in the world. The Goans who are not privileged to have such houses prefer to have a photoshoot of special occasions at these houses. A lot of couples have their pre and postwedding photography at a Goan heritage house. The Braganza Pereira house in Chandor attracts a lot of goan couples to have the photography of the bridal entourage and some special rituals related to a Goan wedding. The world of advertising and films has taken notice of the Goan heritage houses. Producers have used the Goan heritage house for shooting films, documentaries, and even product advertisements. Some of the houses which are open to this idea are the Savordekar Wada at Savordem, the Braganza Pereira in Chandor, the Figueiredo Mansion in Loutolim, and Dr Wilson Fernandes's house in Betalbatim. The income generated from these shoots surely helps the house owners to meet some of the maintenance costs.

Most of these houses have also got tagged as Museums.

Guest houses, Homestays, Heritage Boutique resort, and the titles continue to get upgraded. Goan Heritage houses have been partly converted into guest rooms on a commercial basis and the house owners continue to live in these houses. Some houses have been converted fully into Heritage homestays/guest houses and leased out or partnered on a profit-sharing model with an operator from the hospitality industry.

Hospitality giants like the Taj group have also ventured with a couple of Goan heritage houses in their inventory of guest rooms in Goa. This again is an interesting model with Heritage house owners migrating out of Goa and still retaining their ancestral heritage houses well maintained and above all generating revenue to create a corpus for future maintenance of these heritage houses.

This has indeed become one of Goa's best hospitality experiences for visitors.

And then there are so many other adaptive reuse models that can be explored with the Goan heritage houses. Over the years heritage houses have been converted into restaurants not forgetting "O Coqueiro" in Porvorim which took the lead almost five decades ago, which probably was the first heritage house that initiated the idea of generating revenue for its survival and further prospered as a business house. There are several avenues for revenue for the Goan heritage houses, however, the bottom line is the family should remain united to take forward the idea of conserving Goan Heritage houses. And surely forming a registered Family Trust is the stepping stone in this direction, and I appeal to Goans across the globe

If you feel something, say something

October is Breast Cancer Awareness Month, and I would like to share my story in an attempt to spotlight this treatable disease that afflicts so many women. It has been 6 years that I have been cancer free and I want to encourage women to get tested regularly

It was a stinging pain that lasted for just a few seconds. It left as suddenly as it appeared. It must have been my imagination, I convinced myself. A few weeks went by, and then there it was again. This time, I was shoveling the snow. It was surely the repeated movements that prompted it. A few more weeks and I began to feel a lateral mass.

It just couldn't be. For one, I had a mammogram just 3 months earlier, and received a clean bill of health. But more importantly I thought, Indian women didn't get Breast Cancer. It just wasn't our disease, I had convinced myself. Yes, we die of diabetes and heart disease, even of exhaustion and nagging, but never Breast Cancer.

I had dismissed all fears, until I read an article on the internet of some celebrity, and her admission of how it was not the mammogram, but rather the ultrasound that saved her. Call it providential, I immediately made an appointment with my physician.

"You've got a clean mammogram", my doctor reassured me. But out of an abundance of caution, she wrote up a script for a 3D Mammogram and an ultrasound. I remember being more afraid of the insurance not covering the procedure, than the diagnosis itself

The look on the technician's face said it all. I did not have to wait for the radiologist to confirm my worst fears. You have a Bi-Rad 5, that's all I heard, and all I could think was, "How was I going to juggle my son's upcoming hockey tryouts?" I had messed everything up!

Before I could process another thought, I was whisked away to the 2nd floor. The room presented a very rosy picture. These people surely must love pink. I still had not made the connection with Breast Cancer and Pink. An appointment was made with the breast surgeon and the rest wasn't a mystery. I quickly learned that each breast cancer was different. There are garden varieties, and some more. I learned about triple positive breast cancers, hormonal and triple negatives.

A Cancer diagnosis is always scary. You go through a pendulum of emotions. I was afraid to tell anyone, the stigma of the disease. As a mother of 2 daughters, I was fearful for them. Did I give them anything? Your mind can be a devil's workshop. Faith, Family and Friends became my refuge. I began writing poems to express my deepest fears, and put on my game face every time I underwent some more tests.

I had a lumpectomy within a week, and started chemotherapy. After rounds of grueling chemo and radiation, I am now cancer free. I did all the genetic tests that were available, and each one came back negative. It's been six years, and I still don't know how I got the disease, but I can tell you, it is more common than you think. I was taking my kids for hockey practice after my last round of radiation. I was a little too excited, and I was pulled over for speeding. My first ticket in 25 years!. I tried to use the cancer card, and the cop had the expression, "been there, heard that lady!"

I have learned a few life lessons. Cancer is not the destination, it is a journey and through this journey, I have learned that cancer does not discriminate. It afflicts equally. It changed my perspective on life, and what I previously considered important, now seemed trivial.

I want to tell other women who find themselves in my situation, you are not alone. There are great organizations like the YWCA, American Cancer Society who make sure, you do not have to go through it alone. There is nothing, nothing to be ashamed of. It's okay to ask for help, and when you share your story, you could be helping someone out there, just like someone out there did for me.

Early detection is key, so please get tested regularly. Most importantly, be your own health advocate. If you feel something, say something!

TIPS FROM Dr.Vinette Coelho-D'Costa FOR A WONDERFUL FALL AND HEALTHY WINTER

The Breathtaking colors, crisp autumn air, apple cider and cinnamon or spiced pumpkin...... Speaks Fall. Those Glorious smells a signature of Autumn.

On the other hand, fall means crops are being harvested and stirring up all kinds of dust, mold lying dormant in that pile of colorful leaves to rake up, and ragweed or other allergens in the air. People suffering from Respiratory problems, often have a difficult time during the fall. - Be aware of the air quality and pollutants. Beautiful Countryside drives with the windows rolled down during fall harvest might not be the best idea.
- Avoid smoking or being around second hand smoke if possible. Fall campfires and bonfires are gloriously tempting, but can be common sources of irritants to the lungs
- Be conscious of it being the start of Common cold and flu season.

TIPS to try and outsmart the FLU and Respiratory Viral season: Core Preventive Strategies

- Use good hand washing with soap and water or an alcohol based hand sanitizer
- Try to avoid large crowds and practice social distancing
- Stay up to date with immunizations, especially if you are prone to breathing problems
- Eat a well-balanced diet plenty of fruits and vegetables, natural antioxidants and
- protein all play a part in lung health.
- Stay hydrated
- Get plenty of sleep, and try to avoid excess stress
- Regular physical activity will improve lung health

- Seek health care promptly for testing and/or treatment if you have risk factors for severe illness; treatment may help lower your risk of severe illness
